NOTICE OF EXTENSION OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD FOR PROPOSED
REGULATORY ACTION CONCERNING:
Forms

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Bureau of Real Estate Appraisers (Bureau) has proposed modifications to sections 3527, 3561, 3563, 3568, 3570, 3575, 3602, 3603, 3603, 3681, and 3726 of Title 10 of the California Code of Regulations, related to Forms. These regulations were initially noticed on August 5, 2022. Documents served by e-mailing and posted to the Bureau’s website included the Notice of the Proposed Regulatory Action, proposed text and incorporated forms, and the Initial Statement of Reasons.

The Bureau’s website, however, did not clearly indicate that the documents were for a newly noticed proposed regulation nor did it provide an accurate heading for the topic of the regulations, which may have caused confusion to interested parties wanting to review it. These errors were remedied on August 8, 2022. Therefore, the Bureau is extending the final date of the public comment period from September 20, 2022, to September 24, 2022.

Written comments to the proposed regulations must be **received by the Bureau at its office no later than 5 p.m. September 24, 2022.**
